

Tringa semipalmata



Habitat: Coastal beaches, estuaries, salt marshes, rocky shores, offshore islands and along lake shores.

Prey: Picks and probes for insects, worms, crabs, mollusks, small fishes and some grasses and tender shoots.


Predators: Ravens and crows, snakes, foxes and raccoons all prey upon eggs and chicks; adult predators include raptors, gulls, snakes and otters.

Special features: One of the largest members of the sandpiper family; has white stripes under the wings that are only visible when flying.

Life cycle: Eggs are incubated 22 days, mostly by the female.

Hábitat: Playas costeras, estuarios, marismas, costas rocosas, islas costeras y orillas de lagos.

Presas: Selecciona y sonda para insectos, gusanos, cangrejos, moluscos, peces pequeños y algunas hierbas y brotes tiernos.

Depredadores: Cuervos, serpientes, zorros y mapaches, todos se alimentan de huevos y polluelos; los depredadores de adultos incluyen aves rapaces, gaviotas, serpientes y nutrias.

Características especiales: Uno de los miembros más grandes de la familia de andarríos; tiene rayas blancas debajo de las alas que solo son visibles al volar.

Ciclo de vida: Los huevos se incuban 22 días, principalmente por la hembra.
