— it's also a hotspot destination for migrating & wintering birds,
as well as birding enthusiasts, naturalists, and scientists from all over the globe!

Whether you're a bird-watcher, bird-spotter,
a bander, lister, tucker, or twitcher,
an esteemed **ORNITHOLOGIST**, or if you just fancy birds
—Cabrillo Beach Coastal Park
is on the list of places every 'birder-lover' should visit!

The extremely diverse habitats found along our coastline
draw thousands of breeding, migrating, foraging, and nesting birds
to our sandy beaches, wetlands, mudflats, and rocky shores.

Depending on the species and the season,
you are likely to observe a wide display of bird behaviors
including —cormorants, gulls, and pelicans
hovering, diving, and plunging down on schools of fish.
Sandpipers & willets probing along the surf for buried sand crabs,
or a long-legged heron wading in the mud in search of its next meal!

Birdwatching is a great way to stay connected to the natural world,
so grab a pair of binoculars, your field journal, and a wide-brimmed hat
