The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) is a relatively small agency in the U.S. Department of the Interior that is responsible for development of energy from resources over, in, and under the ocean. From deep beneath the Pacific Ocean's Outer Continental Shelf, oil and gas have been pumped and piped into the U.S. economy and hydrocarbon life-style for most of our lives. As the petroleum reserves mature and production eventually ceases, California society may turn from hydrocarbons to cleaner sources of ocean-based energy.
