Ms. Moore will describe studies in Southern California to identify the types of trash and plastic and how much is being found in our rivers and oceans, as well as what is being done to address the problem.



Shelly Moore is a scientist with the Southern California Coastal Water Research Project (SCCWRP) located in Costa Mesa, CA. She is currently leading regional studies as part of the Southern California Bight Regional Monitoring Program to examine trash in rivers and streams and in the ocean.
